The TOEIC Bridge test measures English-listening and reading skills to provide comprehensive and reliable data on an individual's basic to intermediate ability to communicate in everyday life and common workplace scenarios.



Scores with Meaning

Official score certificates and score reports provide reliable and consistent data that accurately reflect individuals' foundational ability to communicate in English. Test Format and Content

Test takers are asked to complete sentences in written English and answer questions about short informational texts.

- Part 1:** Sentence completion
- Part 2:** Text completion
- Part 3:** Reading comprehension

The TOEIC Bridge test is offered:

As an Institutional Program

- ✓ The test can be taken in person, at a location determined by the organization and under its responsibility.
- ✓ The organization can choose:
 - A paper-based test,
 - An online test, on computer or a tablet.
- ✓ The organization can access the results in an Excel format in its online Customer Account.
- ✓ The results of the Institutional Program are intended for internal use only.

Scores

Scoring scale

- ✓ Each section is scored from 15 to 50 points.
- ✓ The total of the Listening and Reading sections is scored from 30 to 100 points.
- ✓ Each result is correlated with the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR), from level A1 to level B1.

Validity of results

- ✓ Results are valid for 2 years.
